

Dear NJ LEEP Community Members,

I thought they said 2021 was supposed to be a lot better than 2020? In many ways it was, but that does not mean 2021 was easy. Whether it was the class of 2021 having to select a college from a list of schools they had largely never visited or attempting to entice rising 6^{th} and 9^{th} graders to voluntarily spend another month (this time a summer month!) in front of a Zoom screen or it was figuring out how to safely return our staff and students to in-person work. This year was hard! But, true to form, the members of the NJ LEEP community did what they always do – their absolute best. And fundamentally that is what so much of life is about.

Through the continued adversity of the last couple of years, we also have seen so clearly the strength and resilience of our community. Often times the range and depth of challenges folks in our community were navigating felt insurmountable. But that never stopped our students, families and staff from doing their absolute best to ensure our students have every opportunity and resource necessary to unlock their dreams.

One way of describing the approach of NJ LEEP is that we operate from a place of high expectations and compassion. We academically and intellectually challenge our students, while also seeking to recognize and honor how much of an emotional load everyone is carrying right now. We remain committed to both of those strands as mechanisms to enable our students to achieve their goals in life.

Another critical strand of our work is more deeply rooting the work of NJ LEEP in racial equity. We have made a commitment to creating an environment that ensures our students feel loved, seen and celebrated for who they are and because of their identities, not despite them. It is about a deeper, more holistic and more honest approach to elevating Blackness and Latinx heritages (to name two), racial justice and equity, and giving our students an environment that allows them to believe the world is theirs.

Over the course of 2021 we have deepened that commitment by reviewing and beginning to redesign our HR systems, reviewing and redoing all of our curriculum and instructional practices, and taking on the individual work of reflecting on our own personal identities and how those impact the work we do at NJ LEEP.

While I have no idea what 2022 will hold, I do know that we are going to keep pushing to find students and staff who are searching for a special community, we are going to keep asking ourselves and our students what we have learned from each new experience or activity, we are going to keep investing in our team, our students, our facilities and our programs, and we are going to keep listening to our community to understand how we can better serve them every single day.

That is our decision – to be the best version of NJ	LÉEP we can.

2020-21 Program Overview



MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM

In 2019 we launched our program and will scale to approximately 120 6th, 7th, and 8th graders by summer 2021.

Our school-year Saturday program focuses on Math and ELA skill development, social-emotional and project-based learning, and STEM and critical-thinking enrichments.

Summer focuses on hands-on experiential and project-based learning, STEM, and math and reading skill development.

6TH GRADE

Summer Project: a "Pitch Competition" to convince a company to choose Newark as the location for their new headquarters.

7TH GRADE

Summer Project: Present on social justice issues like Human Trafficking, Bullying, and Black Lives Matter, and talk about the "Game Changers" who lead and influence these movements.

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

Our goal is to create a seamless path for families to support their children through college graduation and beyond. Family workshops and 1-on-1 meetings increase family involvement, improving educational outcomes for students.

HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

Students attend programming during summer, after school and also participate in our Saturday Writing Program twice a month to develop into better writers and readers.

SUMMER LAW INSTITUTE

Rising freshmen learn criminal law and participate in a mock trial competition.

9TH GRADE: Life Skills Freshmen learn study skills and professionalism, explore colleges and careers, and navigating relationships.

SUMMER WEEK-ON-THE-JOB Rising sophomores participate in four experiences at corporate offices.

10TH GRADE: Law-Related Education Sophomores develop writing and public speaking skills and work with an attorney mentor during our Constitutional Law & Debate Program

SUMMER ACT TEST PREP Rising juniors take a 5-week ACT prep course.

11TH GRADE: ACT Test Prep Juniors learn test-taking strategies and build math, verbal, and writing skills to improve their ACT score.

SUMMER PRE-CAP and 12TH GRADE Seniors participate in our College Access Program.
